FACE SPONSORS ADULT GIRLS AT A VOCATIONAL SCHOOL

On our last trip to Ghana, FACE strengthened its connection with Mary Massop Vocational school in Gambaga in the northern region of Ghana. This school offers a 3-year textile weaving, basket weaving and sewing skills program to young adult women.

The northern region is the poorest region of Ghana and this school is well situated to help these 18 to 25 year old women gain some vocational skills so they can be self-sufficient and escape poverty.

FACE sponsors 20 students at this school, girls who otherwise could not afford to attend the school. Some of the students have babies and they are allowed to bring their babies to school sometimes tied on mom's back or lying on a cloth close to mom.
